From the Ram's Den

I want to repeat here the theme I emphasized in my part of the pastors' "state of the church" sermon on Annual Meeting Sunday. I want to be sure it gets to all of you who missed that day, and I don't mind at all repeating it for those of you who were there.

On the first of May we will mark five years of service by your pastoral team. When Lynn, Dave and I began, I remember explaining to Elsa and to others who knew the medical model: "It's like I'm the head of the department and I have three residents." One of those residents has "graduated from residency" and gone on to do his own service in his own "practice." Dave and Lynn have stayed here at Zion. While their faithfulness to our ministry might suggest to some that they needed to be continued in advanced training, that is not the case. By last Summer it was clear to me that both Lynn and Dave had "graduated" from residency. They had become fully qualified professional practitioners. They have continued to be ready to learn, but that is not a sign of their being beginners. I have long since learned that it is one of the key marks of a real professional. The quality of their service here provides the other essential mark of a real professional – competence.

Now if you or I were to try this line on them, they would probably show embarrassment and start belittling their accomplishments. The old fashioned name for that kind of behavior is humility. That's not a sign of a real professional, but it is a sign of a genuine human being. In fact, their "denial" would very possibly be stated humorously. I take that as another sign of genuine humanity, at least the kind we like to be around. Certainly, we have often shared humor among us in staff meetings - and elsewhere.

Still another way they would try to avoid our praise would be some comment on along the lines of "It is just one more sign that God is still speaking." And that points to the most important reality about them. They are real Christians. Their spirituality is genuine, filling their presence. They know that their gifts are gifts from God. They know that the good

things that have been happening to Zion Church are gifts from God. They know that our challenges for the future are gifts from God.

Their devotion shows in many ways. Those of you who receive our email prayers will often have seen it shining through their comments on needs for which we've been asked to pray. I have seen it as well when they have personally been hit hard by one of the difficult times of life.

Norm Kansfield has been meeting with us regularly for the last few months. In a conversation between Norm and me about good things that have developed in Zion, I said I saw Lynn and Dave as gifts from God. To which, Norm commented: "You are really fortunate in the colleagues God has sent vou."

So, it is time to recognize pleasant reality and celebrate. Lynn and Dave have "graduated" from their residency. They are full-fledged practitioners of the pastoral arts. I just thank God that they are committed to continuing to practice them here at Zion.

Lenten Sermon Series

At pastoral staff meeting recently, we were reviewing our plans for worship in the coming weeks and looking at the possibility of sharing a Lenten study series with two other congregations. We decided to carry that a step forward and look at the Scripture passages assigned for the Sundays of Lent. I suggested that each of us look at the texts for the Sunday(s) we would preach and see what reached out to grab us as God still speaking. The result was our recognition that we really had a sermon series on our hands. This note is to share our thought and preliminary plan with you, so you can play around with the ideas yourself and come even more prepared to join in worship and the act of preaching (it's true: the listener is an active participant in all good preaching). Our theme is "The Ways We Come to Christ." It

(John 11:1-45, Norm preaching)

March 15 (Palm Sunday), Marching

(Matt 21:1-11, Bill preaching)

March 23 (Easter), Weeping

(John 20:1-18, Bill preaching)

Doing Theology Together

Several of you have asked, "What does a Resident Theologian do?" Or, for that matter, what does any theologian do? A theologian is a person who thinks about God, and who seeks to help others think about God. The Bible is the book that God has given to the church to help the church understand what God is like and what God wants for us and from us. But the Bible is not written in the way that we are used to books being written. It doesn't say to us, "This is what God is like." Instead, the Bible tells us stories about God and God's interaction with people, over the course of long centuries of time. It gives us a bit of information about God here, and another bit of information about God there. The first job of a theologian, then, is to track those bits of information, and to connect them, just as we used to connect the dots to reveal the outline of a picture. This allows us to say specific things about God – such as "God is, above all else, gracious." A theologian then helps others understand what the picture means, and teaches others how to go about connecting the dots themselves.

Greetings from Our 2008 Budget

Hello again. I'm trying to get used to talking to you all each month.

This month gives me an obvious starting point. What else can I say?!

That starting point is the great beginning for my year. You do know how to make a budget feel good. Your regular envelope giving is what keeps us moving forward. So I have to say, "Thank you."

You heard me fussing last month about possible problems from things beyond our control. Well, we've avoided one of them for the time being, anyway. We can be thankful that January spared us from weather cancellations. Your giving didn't have to double up to compensate (as it did in December); it just sailed right through.

I'm afraid I can't say that about the squeeze on our personal budgets. If recession hadn't been the big economic worry last month, I'd go on about inflation. In short, we really are facing higher costs for the basic things of our lives – to say nothing of the special things. Zion is facing those pressures, too. Our treasurer figured that we spent \$74.00 per day on heating in December. There is another increase in my pay responsibilities that was within Zion's control; but the need to take it on was not really a spiritual option for your leaders. As you affirmed in your vote at the Annual Meeting, we owe it to ourselves and our staff to provide 5% annual increases. And in the case of Lynn and Dave, we need to start moving what we pay up to match the time they in fact give. That is a spiritually necessary increase in budget, but that doesn't stop me from being concerned about finding a matching increase in the income I receive.

So I'll pass on what seems to me to be a "neat idea." I overheard it at a Finance Committee meeting. I think they were planning to say something at the Annual Meeting, so this may not come to you as a new idea. But I think it is a good one.

One of the counters had noticed in the process of recording the contributions that a couple of Zion's

people seemed to be adding a dollar to their weekly offering each week. Now, that may have been what they put on their personal faith promise card, but one dollar more than a round number sure looked like adding a special little something.

That's a different way to "adopt a budget." Adding a dollar each week is not likely to be a financial problem for anyone, and the added \$50.00 apiece if each of us did that all year would make a huge difference for me. Think about it. Better yet, try it for a few weeks. If you do, I think you'll find it's made no problem for your personal budget and you'll feel extra good about doing a little extra to help your church.

Seems to me, a suggestion like that is really like taking a gift to a party. It's a way of saying thanks. And, as usual, that's what I mostly want to say to you: Thank you.
