

Seven Pines Park

A regional park with baseball fields, picnic tables.

Ice Lake

A regional preserve with small manmade lake. Walking, contemplation, birdwatching

Nothstein Preserve

Paradise Township preserve of over 100 acres along the Cranberry Creek. Walking, hiking, birdwatching, fishing, and other recreation.

Knauf Farm Preserve

Paradise Township preserve of over 35 acres with wetlands and small creek. Walking, hiking, birdwatching, and other recreation.

The Roof

Paradise Township park for active recreation including baseball fields, basketball courts, playground and picnic pavilion. To reserve the pavilion, call 595-9880 x

Posie's Park

Paradise Township pocket park near the Municipal Building. Gazebo and natural gardens.

Little Park

Paradise Township park adjacent to Paradise Creek, with baseball field, playground, benches and picnic tables.

Kurmes Nature Preserve

Open space preserve maintained by Pocono Heritage Land Trust. Four hundred acres with streams, views, hiking, birdwatching and other recreation.

The Knob

Open space preserve owned by neighboring Mount Pocono Borough. One of the best views in the area, excellent site for viewing summer meteor showers.

Red Rock Mountain Biking

Technical trails specifically for mountain bikers open to the public by Mount Airy. Hikers are welcome. Picnic table.

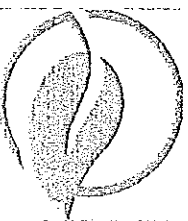
Guided Hikes
