# THE CHAMBER WELCOMES **GOVERNOR ED RENDELL**

A lunch sponsored by the Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce for Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell was held on Thursday June 17, 2004 at Stroudsmoor Country Inn. More than 300 local leaders attended the luncheon to hear Governor Rendell summarize his job creating and economic stimulus package, which recently received overwhelming bipartisan approval from the General Assembly.

The Governor outlined the various stimulus programs and how they will address the area's needs for an infrastructure that will support business and new investment that will help to create and retain jobs. He also commented on how important tourism is to Monroe County's economy comparing it to agriculture as being one of Pennsylvania's two largest industries.

"I want businesses in Monroe County and throughout the Commonwealth to take notice--through the various economic stimulus programs, I will do everything I can to support public and private sector growth while maintaining a keen focus on creating and retaining jobs," said Governor Rendell. "We not only have a plan for a New Pennsylvania, but the tools we need to build it together."

The Governor explained that by leveraging more than \$2 billion in "We are very pleased that Governor Rendell accepted the Chamber's grants, guarantees, and loans over the next three years, the economic invitation to speak at this luncheon," said Chamber President/CEO stimulus plan will generate an additional \$5 billion in private-sector Robert P. On June 17 2004, the Pocono Mountains Chamber of Commerce arranged a luncheon for Pennsylvania Governor Edward G. Rendell. This historic Chamber event, attended by 300 local leaders, was accommodated through the gracious and elegant hospitality of Andy and Linda Forte of Stroudsmoor Country Inn.

Economic experts have asserted that this plan is one of the most comprehensive economic stimulus packages in the United States.

Any funds awarded to us would be used to enhance our county's programs, and to extend benefits that will promote our region's economic and business growth.
